<p>I'd like to breastfeed, but I know I'm going to start partying soon, so I guess I better just bottle feed.</p>	<p>My breasts are so full they hurt! And now he won't latch on. He was doing really great until now.</p>	<p>My baby is so sick. I don't know if he will make it.</p>	<p>The doctor said my baby has Down's Syndrome. Maybe I better bottle feed him.</p>

She is going to take care of the baby during the night for me. Can you please bring a bottle for her?</p>	<p>In my country we rest for 40 days after the baby is born. My nanny will be taking care of everything when I go home.</p>	<p>I'm new to this state. I really don't know anybody. What am I going to do if I have questions after I go home?</p>
<p>This baby cries and cries. You are so good and calming him down. Can you come home with me?</p>	<p>With my last baby they gave bottles before I even saw him. He never latched on after that.</p>	<p>In my breastfeeding class they told us to keep the baby skin-to-skin as much as possible.
