

# Guide for Use of the Breastfeeding Friendly Self-Assessment Tool

## Purpose of this tool:

To assess the degree to which an entity supports breastfeeding families

### Who should complete this tool?

Organizations, agencies or businesses who serve families, such as but not limited to hospitals, health departments, physicians' practices, Parents as Teachers, Infant Toddler Services, etc.

## How can the "Breastfeeding Friendly Self-Assessment Tool" be used?

By the organization/agency to identify areas to strengthen their breastfeeding support

By local breastfeeding coalitions to identify community needs related to breastfeed support when results are compiled from multiple organizations/agencies

## **Uses NOT permitted:**

As a screening tool for membership or involvement in a breastfeeding coalition or workgroup

As a scoring mechanism, to rank or rate organizations/agencies/businesses' degree of breastfeeding support

1)	Recognize breastfeeding as part of a normal, healthy diet for infants and young children and acknowledges the role it plays in supporting, promoting and protecting breastfeeding.					
2)	Ensure that all public-facing printed materials and website images are free of bottles, bottle feeding and pacifiers.					
3)	Refuse promotional items, educational materials, coupons, samples, food and/or gifts from infant formula companies.					
4)	Ensure parent education materials are free of commercial influence and no more than five years past the publication.					
5)	Display a welcoming atmosphere to breastfeeding families and have educated all staff about the importance of supporting breastfeeding families. 6)	Provide a supportive environment and appropriate accommodations for our breastfeeding employees. This includes ensuring a private space (other than a restroom) and reasonable time for milk expression.
