# KanCare Breast Pump Coverage & Access

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Breast pumps\* and replacement parts are covered for all KanCare female beneficiaries ages 12 through 55.

To ensure timely access, a breast pump should be ordered *during pregnancy*, at least 3 weeks before their estimated due date.

### **Covered Breast Pumps and Part<sup>1</sup>**

#### **Covered breast pumps**

E0602 – manual breast pump  
E0603 – electric breast pump

#### **Covered breast pump replacement parts**

A4281 – replacement breast pump tube  
A4282 – adapter for breast pump, replacement  
A4283 – cap for breast pump bottle, replacement  
A4285 – polycarbonate bottle for use with breast pump, replacement  
A4286 – locking ring for breast pump, replacement

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Coverage is limited to a combined total of no more than 1 pump every year.

Coverage is limited to no more than 2 of each replacement part per year

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\* Exclusions: The E0604 Hospital grade breast pump and A4284 replacement breast pump shield and splash protector are excluded from coverage.

### **Local options:**

Durable Medical Equipment (DME) vendors may have breast pumps on hand or be able to order a breast pump. Call Member Services phone number found in the back of the member's Medicaid card.

### **Process for obtaining a breast pump through KanCare:**

- Member obtains a prescription from their physician, preferably during pregnancy
- Local DME:
  - Member must bring Photo ID and Medicaid insurance card
  - Member will be asked to complete a form required by DME
- Online DME:
  - Member must enter Medicaid insurance card information
  - Member must have physician prescription and/or name of prescribing physician



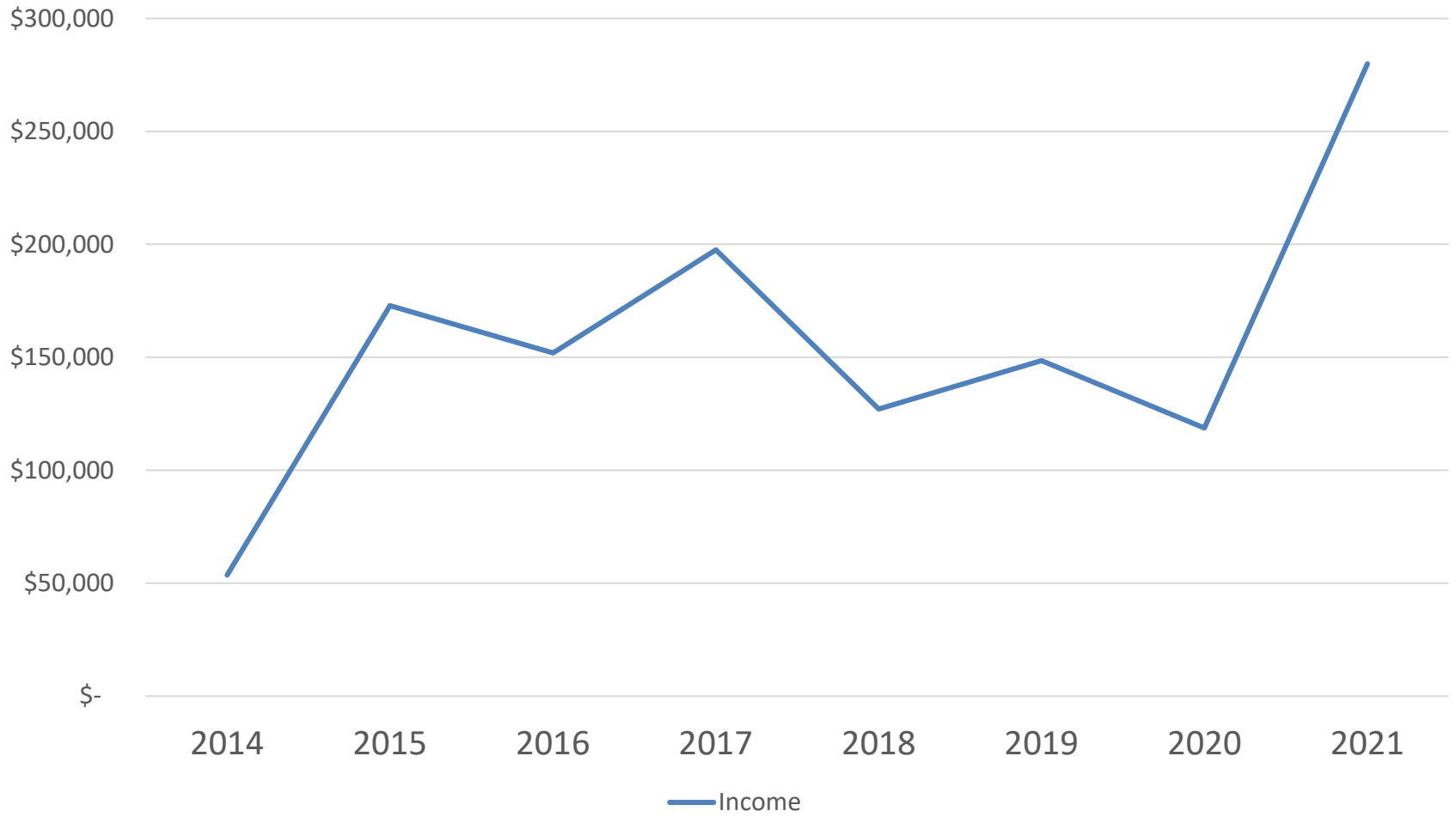

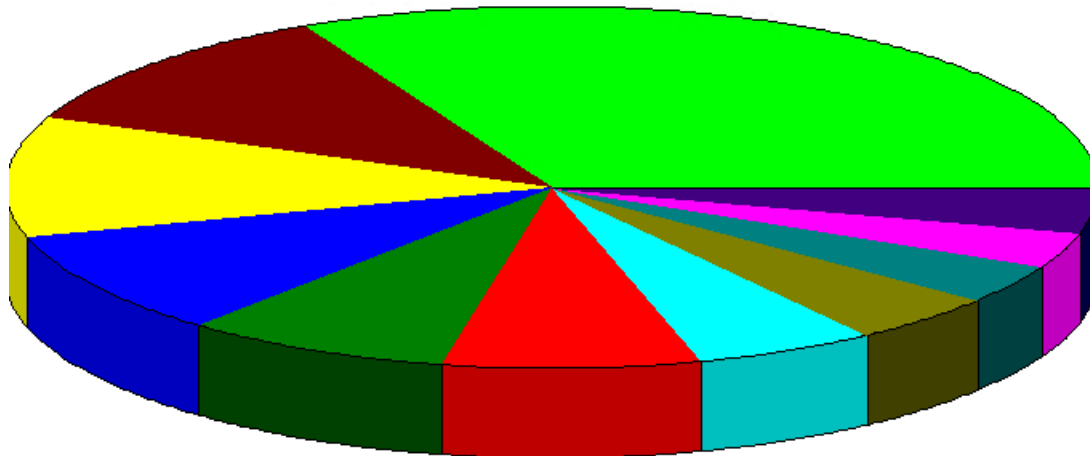


# KBC Annual Revenue

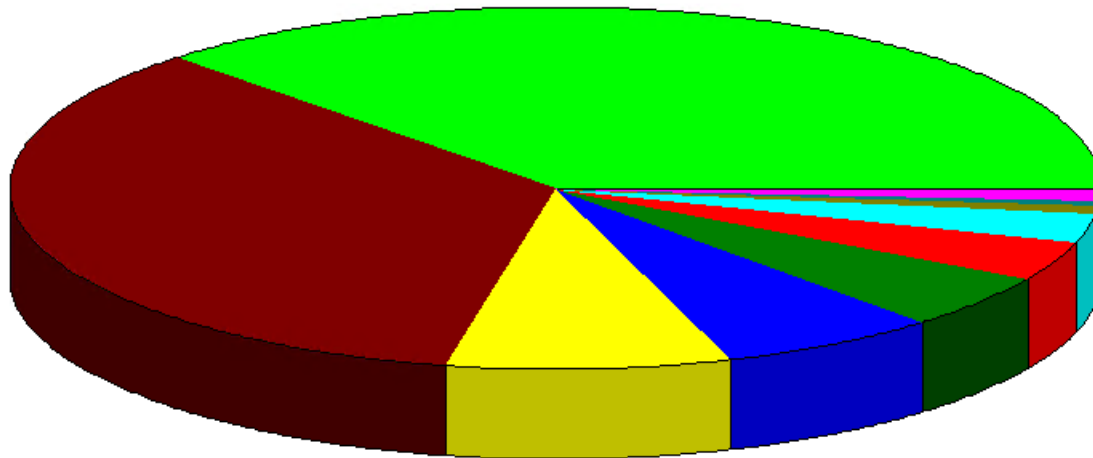

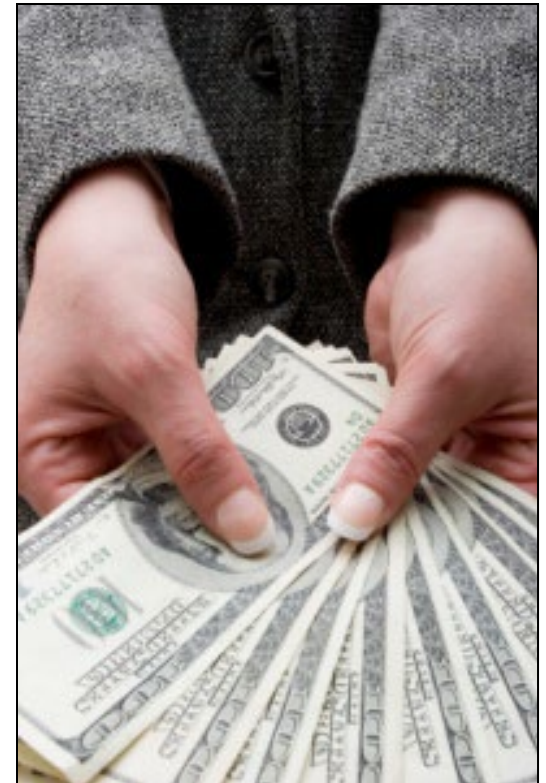

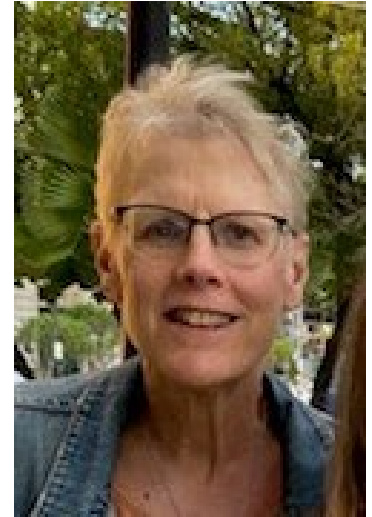

# Breastfeeding Friendly Local Health Department Designation

*The Breastfeeding Friendly Local Health Department designation was developed by the Kansas Breastfeeding Coalition and Wichita State University through the support of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment*





# Breastfeeding Friendly Local Health Department Designation

**Criteria #1: Community Engagement** – One or more staff members from the LHD regularly attend the meetings of the local breastfeeding coalition.

**Criteria #2: Referral System** - The LHD has a written agreement or referral form with the hospital(s) where the majority of clients give birth to be notified within 1-2 days of when clients give birth.

**Criteria #3: Staff Education** – All staff who are more than 50% full-time have completed the required staff education (view 3-5 minute video) and signed a statement to that effect.

**Criteria #4: Welcoming Environment for Breastfeeding Families** – enrolled in Breastfeeding Welcome Here program

**Criteria #5: Support of Breastfeeding Employees** – LHD has received the Gold level “Breastfeeding Employee Support Award” from the Kansas Breastfeeding Coalition.

**Criteria #6: Prenatal Breastfeeding Education:** The LHD provides prenatal breastfeeding education or refers all families, including those not enrolled in WIC, to local or online prenatal breastfeeding education.

**Criteria #7: Breastfeeding Support** - LHD provides services or referrals for culturally congruent lactation support from a credentialed provider OR peer support person with required education.
