Speak at local SHRM affiliate meetings or local chambers of commerce meetings, and distribute award applications.

Promotional Ideas:

Initial Designation—all provided by KBC

- Proclamation—for city or county commission to read
- Certificate suitable for framing
- Press Release
- Social Media post examples and hashtags (#CSBKBC)
- Newspaper ad—example
- Widget- use new logo, need embed code to link back to KBC CSB page
- QR code—direct to KBC CSB page
- Signage—billboard, sign at city limits

Ongoing awareness campaign—on anniversary of designation, during National Breastfeeding Month, etc.

- Newspaper ad and/or social media post to celebrate participating businesses and encourage others to join the list
- Library display
- Certificates or thank you gifts to participating businesses
- Flyer—explain designation and list participating businesses, distribute in public library, chamber of commerce, city hall, etc.
- Presentation to City/County Commission or Chamber of Commerce
- · Promote during Infant Feeding session of Becoming a Mom and other prenatal parent education classes
- Promote to LiveWell and Pathways organization

Goals of promotion:

- Raise awareness of the importance of everyone in community in supporting breastfeeding families, not just 2-3 sectors like hospitals, physician offices and health dept.
- Explain the designation criteria and the prestige of achieving the designation

Building on the Designation:

- Build continuity of care between systems—see NACCHO Continuity of Care for Breastfeeding Blueprint (coming fall 2021)
- Address infant formula marketing in all sectors
- Address use of images and diverse photos in the community's materials (Resource: <u>USBC Landscape of Breastfeeding Support Image Gallery</u>)
- Learn more about racial/ethnic equity and cultural humility (Resource: KBC Racial & Ethnic Equity)
- Promote on-going breastfeeding education for those sectors serving families
- Strengthen prenatal education and conversations about breastfeeding across sectors
