






- Phone Calls + Emails

- HD would provide lab draw/receive milk and store
- Shipped milk when boxes full
- Bank provides shipping materials
- Depot provided dry ice Used some grant funds. (now OKC covers cost!)





 Bank provides supplies: shipping boxes, cooler packs, reimbursement for dry ice

 Depot has at least 1 person trained in receiving, packing, & shipping milk.

Fielding phone calls about how to donate



Buy in and cooperation from non-WIC agencies:
HD Clinic staff, MCH, physicians' offices

Ship day: 1-3 hours

~ 1 x a month or less

Freezer temp daily
(less than 1 minute!)






THE 2022 STATE OF BREASTFEEDING IN KANSAS







Kansas ranks 14th in the nation for rates of infants exclusively breastfeeding at 6 months.

If 90% of Kansas babies breastfed exclusively for six months, each year Kansas would save...




