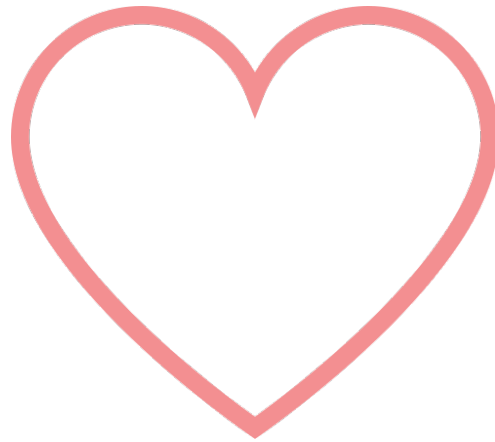
KBC Mission: To improve the health and well-being of Kansans by working collaboratively to promote, protect and support breastfeeding.

store

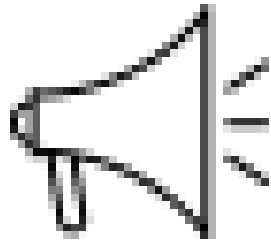
- Shipped milk when boxes full





- Bank provides supplies: shipping boxes, cooler packs, reimbursement for dry ice
- Depot has at least 1 person trained in receiving, packing, & shipping milk.
- Fielding phone calls about how to donate



Buy in and cooperation from

HD Clinic staff, MCH,
physicians' offices

Ship day : 1-3 hours

~ 1 x a month or less

Freezer temp daily

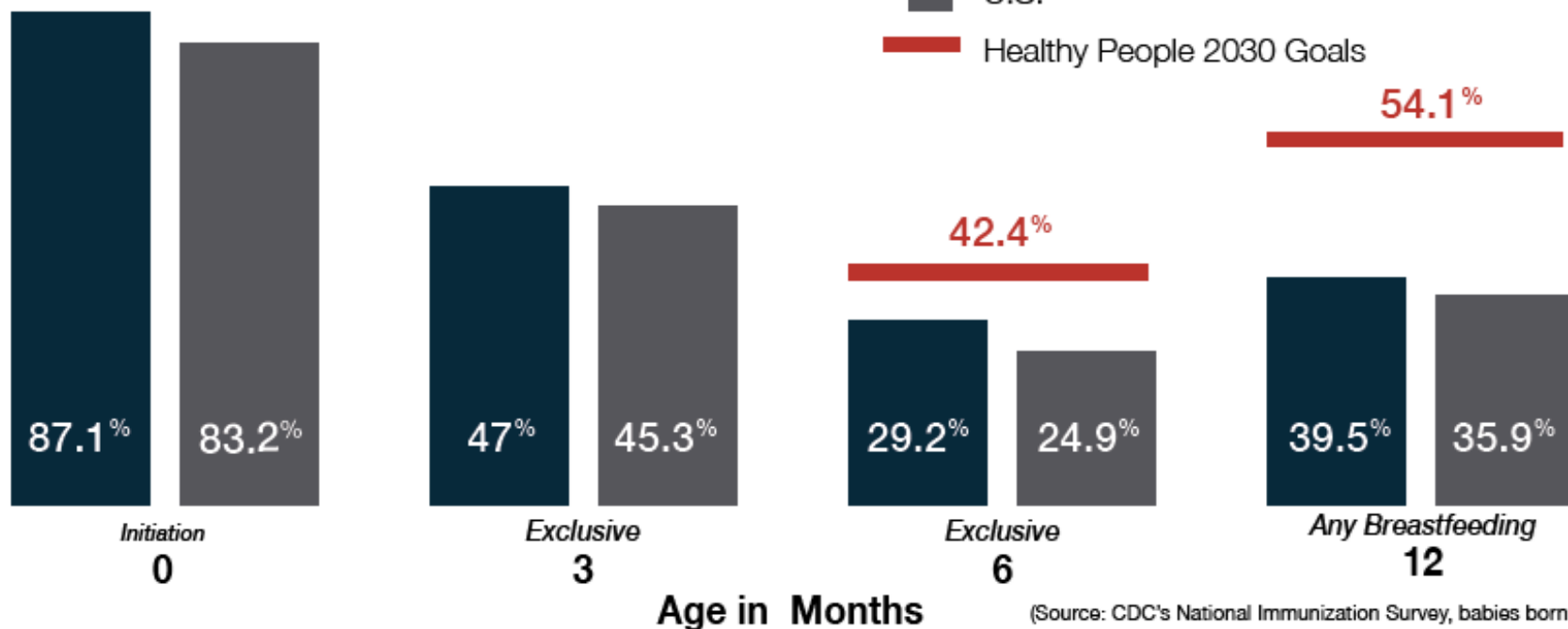
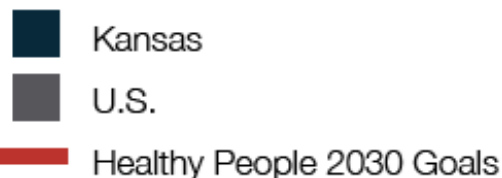

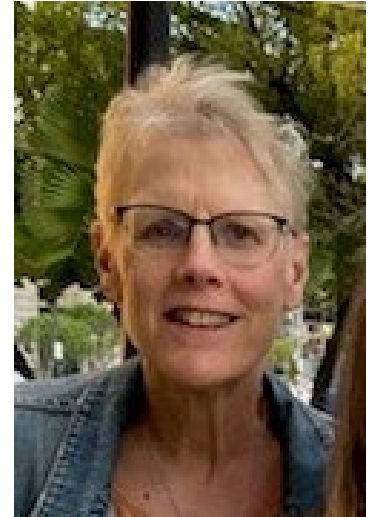
