Professionals focusing more specifically on issues of infancy and early childhood mental health


Cross-disciplinary relevance of infant and early childhood mental health

Infant Mental Health Endorsement (IMH-E®)

- Recognizes achievement of knowledge and training
- Recognizes specific work with infants and toddlers (ages 0-3) and their caregivers
- Identifies best practice competencies at multiple levels and across disciplines
- Offers a pathway for professional development in the infant, early childhood and family field

CREDENTIAL: The Endorsement <u>is not</u> a license or certification

Why is the *IMH Endorsement*® Important to Me & My Professional Development?

- "It holds us to a higher standard; being Endorsed means you may be able to educate families better on infant mental health."

Area of Expertise & Competencies

Theoretical Foundations

 Pregnancy & early parenthood, infant development/behavior, cultural competence, attachment, etc.

Law, Regulation & Agency Policy

Ethical practice, agency policy, etc.

Systems Expertise

Service delivery systems, community resources

Direct Service Skills

 Observation and listening, screening and assessment, developmental guidance, etc.

Working with Others

 Collaborating, resolving conflict, etc.

Communicating

· Listening, speaking, writing

Thinking

 Solving problems, planning/organizing, etc.

Reflection

 Contemplating, self awareness, curiosity, etc.

Reflective Supervision/Consultation (RS/C)

- Specific type of supervision that is the standard of practice in the early childhood field.
- Distinction due to the shared exploration of the parallel process.
 - All of the relationships are important
 - How do each of these relationships affect the others?
 - Attend to the emotional content of the work and how reactions to the content affect the work.



What is the process?



- 1. Contact the Endorsement Coordinator
- 2. Join KAIMH Membership
- Register on EASy to start the online application
- Learn about competencies and gather training information
- 5. Submit your KAIMH Infant Mental Health Endorsement® application.

Language Disclaimer

The Kansas Breastfeeding Coalition (KBC) recognizes and respects that pregnant, birthing, postpartum, and parenting people have a range of gender identities and do not always identify as "women" or "mothers." In recognition of the diversity of identities, the KBC uses both gendered terms, as well as gender-neutral terms such as "people," "pregnant people," "parent," and "birthing persons." In referencing studies, the KBC will use the typically gendered language of the authors. We also use "chestfeeding," a gender-neutral term, along with "breastfeeding," but most references to this biological process are to "breastfeeding" study results.

- 2023 Public Health Section meetings will focus on the BF LHD Deep Dive series and Learning Moments.






