



State of Breastfeeding in Kansas 2025

PERCENTAGE OF KANSAS BABIES ON WIC BREASTFEEDING EXCLUSIVELY AT AGE 6 MONTHS





Kansas continues to exceed the national average in all measures. However, our state has fallen to 29th in the national rankings with declining breastfeeding duration rates.
